

20. Jessie Pinnick, Princess Cyd



At the very beginning of Stephen Cone's *Princess Cyd*, Jessie Pinnick's Cyd is defined by a lack of curiosity that nearly perturbs her aunt, successful writer Miranda Ruth (Rebecca Spence). Cyd doesn't really read, is not especially into the philosophical or metaphysical questions of life that her aunt explores in her writing. Cyd is, in essence, uninterested in the way we narrativize our lives. But that changes when Cyd's bond with Miranda grows closer, and she stumbles into an attraction to Katie (Malic White), a genderqueer barista. Cyd's maturation—emotional and erotic—is astounding, and even when Cyd is unsure of herself or the scope of her life's plot, Pinnick, as a performer, embraces that uncertainty, striking when need be with subtle offense, or exposing herself with tenderness. The camera is totally enraptured by her confidence. And, in the end, as she walks into the sunlight, we know Pinnick had control over the whole story. —*Kyle Turner*



Besides the unexpectedly sweet trajectory of its internal conflicts, Princess Cyd also finds ways to impress as a visual object. A dedication to sunlit, natural lighting affords the film an idyllic Garden of Eden glow that matches the warm, simple beauty of the story it tells. Often, its form & content work wonderfully in tandem, like in a shot where Cyd & her same-sex love interest approach the camera on a long stroll while getting acquainted, physically getting closer to the audience while they get socially get closer to one other. That kind of simple beauty in gradually blooming intimacy is a large part of what makes the film feel special & worthwhile. Princess Cyd tells a simple story of two estranged women becoming close over a couple isolated weeks spent together, but its lingering effect grows on you so gradually you don't even realize how much you get out of the experience until well after it's over.





15. Princess Cyd

The rise of Stephen Cone may be one of the numerous ways in which Trump is inadvertently making America great again. Our president's complete absence of empathy has made moviegoers hungrier than ever for it, and few filmmakers are as gifted in supplying it and inspiring it as Cone. Ever since I saw his breakout ensemble piece, "The Wise Kids," five years ago, he has been one of my favorite directors. Cone's pictures are timeless slices of life that also speak to the present moment, often juxtaposing the perspectives of people from different generations as they come of age, and his latest has become his most acclaimed to date. Like "The Post," "Princess Cyd" was birthed from a sudden burst of creativity, and it is a triumph of richly intuitive filmmaking. The sublime Rebecca Spence stars as Miranda, a writer in the vein of Emily Dickinson. She is comfortable with being single, remaining in the home of her youth and embracing her spirituality without feeling bound by church law. Her niece, Cyd (Jessie Pinnick), is impulsive in ways people her age often are, bursting with hormones while falling for a local girl (a magnetic Malic White) during her summer at Miranda's Chicago home. When Cyd makes a carelessly cruel observation about her aunt's nonexistent sex life, Miranda counters with a firm but loving reply: "It's not a handicap to be one way and not another." Her deceptively simple wisdom serves as a healing remedy for our caustically divided culture, magnifying how our differences should be celebrated rather than shunned.

Stephen Cone is a master of small, carefully realized filmmaking; his earlier films such as *The Wise Kids* and *Henry Gamble's Birthday Party* combine an unusual level of empathy for his characters with an unusual combination of interests: love, desire, sexual awakenings, and religion. *Princess Cyd* is his most accomplished film yet, about a young woman named Cyd (**Jessie Pinnick**) who finds herself attracted to Katie (**Malic White**), a barista, while visiting her Aunt Miranda (**Rebecca Spence**, playing a character modeled on the author Marilynne Robinson) in Chicago. As she works through her own sexual awakening with Katie, Cyd unwinds some of the ways Miranda's life has gotten too safe. They provoke each other while forming a bond and being prodded toward a bigger understanding of the world. It is a graceful and honest film, and it feels like a modest miracle.





Intimate connections among women

When the cartoonish movie "Wonder Woman" was released this past summer, it was hailed by some critics as a breakthrough because of the strong woman characters in the usually maledominated superhero genre. But the overhyped "Wonder Woman" can't compare in either complexity or the intelligent, emotionally adventurous women portrayed in Stephen Cone's "Princess Cyd," just released on DVD by Wolfe Video. Playing to an enthusiastic audience at this year's Frameline Festival, "Princess Cyd" confirmed Cone, who gave us the wondrous "Henry Gamble's Birthday Party" and the insightful "Wise Kids," as one of the premier and underrated LGBT filmmakers working today. "Cyd" is another jewel to be added to Cone's crown.

Like his previous films, "Cyd" is character-driven, inserting subtext into the languid spaces in-between dialogue. Unlike the first two movies showcasing Cone's mastery of ensemble playing (amidst evangelical Christian circles, since his father is a pastor), "Cyd" primarily depicts two characters bemusedly getting to know each other, moving from strangers to familial ties with a past tragic event lurking in the background, whose full dimension won't be revealed until much later. The film opens with a 911 call. Cyd's mother has



As kind a movie as there was this year, writer-director Stephen Cone's tiny, deeply felt character study is modest, thoughtful, and decent. It's a story of family connection and self-realization that's never cloying or preachy, which is hard to do. Yet Cone, quietly asserting himself as a major talent, more than pulls it off, with the immeasurable help of his two lead actresses: Jessie Pinnick and the remarkable Rebecca Spence. Pinnick plays the title character, a teenage girl with a tragic past who travels to Chicago to spend a few summer weeks with her aunt, a celebrated novelist and academic with an active religious life, played with abounding grace and intelligence by Spence. (Where the heck has she been hiding? Someone give her the Carrie Coon treatment—if she wants it.) Princess Cyd is a fluid, contemplative look at exchange, at two people learning things from one another, as Cyd and her aunt negotiate a relationship around differences of age, ideology, and experience. How heartening to see big topics—like faith, like sexuality—discussed in such warm, considerate terms by two such gifted actresses. Princess Cyd is also

a soft-spoken coming-out film, a loving and subtle tribute to Chicago, and, in one sequence that should be corny but somehow isn't, an earnest appreciation of good literature. The kind that can—like this little jewel of a movie—transport, uplift, and humbly inspire.

"Despite all three of his most recent films telling coming-of-age stories, Cone claims to have no "overt interest" in the genre; rather, he seeks to explore "where identity comes from and the shift in people". And, certainly, the philosophical inquiries that Cone weaves into the narrative allow his characters to transcend the more vapid concerns of stock coming-of-age figures, whilst also retaining a degree of naivety and gentleness. Much of the film seems to revolve around the question of what fulfilment is. Miranda and Cyd approach this question from discrete perspectives that further betray their difference in age — Cyd is of the body, Miranda the spirit. After an argument concerning Cyd's failure to understand her aunt's lengthy sexual dry spell, Miranda tells her, "we are different shapes and different ways" — reading and religion give her the same pleasure that Cyd is just beginning to experience through her body.

Cone has crafted his coming-of-age movie with sympathy and specificity. He's helped by his fantastic cast. Rebecca Spence and Jessie Pinnick are both relative unknowns, but after their performances in Princess Cyd, they surely won't be for much longer.

Both actresses navigate the nuance of their characters with grace and precision. A few wrong turns and Miranda's insecurities could well have become grating, but Spence imbues her character with such vulnerability that you can't help but feel for her, especially after her niece has been casually rude.

Pinnick arguably had an even harder job inhabiting Cyd. Spence is gifted that terrific monologue and an altogether more eloquent personality. The screenplay doesn't grant Cyd so many chances to explain herself. You sense the change she undergoes throughout the film through the expressions on her face; at the film's opening she's rather blank, but as each new understanding hits, her eyes become more alive and you can see what she's thinking. Whilst Miranda stays largely the same throughout the movie, Cyd undergoes a subtle transformation, and Pinnick's finely-drawn portrayal of this is

wonderful to watch.

Not one element of Princess Cyd could be accused of being melodramatic or over-emotional. There are no extravagant set-pieces underlined by a swelling score. Yet by the time the film draws to a close, it still feels as if you've been through the emotional wringer. Cone marries his specific characters to his wider message of acceptance, without making the film feel didactic or preachy. It may be a small movie, but that achievement is enormous.



Without having played any local festivals, the film arrived this week in Los Angeles and is more than worth a look, even during the season of loftier prestige titles.

In her review for The Times, Katie Walsh wrote, "'Princess Cyd' is many things: a queer coming-of-age story (Malic White is fantastic as Cyd's summer fling, Katie), a tribute to intergenerational friendship, a redemption tale. But it also captures one deeply significant thing, that moment when family members transform from strangers to loved ones."

Also for The Times, Akiva Gottlieb spoke to Cone, who said, "I'm interested in teenagers insofar as that is the most transformative portion of life. ... The journey from 16 to 24 is a big deal, and it's when a lot of sexual and spiritual discoveries are made."

At the Chicago Tribune, Michael Phillips added, "The performances by Pinnick and Spence are clean, vivid and honestly felt, with a lot of the best work emerging nonverbally in the spaces between characters closing a gap. ... These are traits you find in someone's work when you genuinely like the characters, and want more from them."

At New York magazine's Vulture site, Emily Yoshida said, "In Cone's film any pain can seemingly be relieved by the simple, generous act of liking someone — not to possess them, but to have your world changed by them. Princess Cyd is a wonderful movie to live in for this reason; it's full of hope and empathy, as are its two leads. This is a film that believes finding joy in each other is not just what we should do but what we are naturally inclined to do, and man, oh, man, do I want to believe that right now."





No modern filmmaker nurtures the soul quite like Stephen Cone. His movies are timeless slices of life that also speak to the present moment, often juxtaposing the perspectives of people from different generations as they come of age. Ever since I saw Cone's extraordinary 2011 film, "The Wise Kids," about various members of a Southern Baptist community, I have interviewed the director about each of his subsequent features: 2013's haunting ode to theatre, "Black Box"; 2014's arrestingly intimate "This Afternoon"; and 2015's Altmanesque marvel, "Henry Gamble's Birthday Party." His latest picture, "Princess Cyd," may be his most acclaimed picture to date, and easily ranks among the best films I've seen this year. It stars Rebecca Spence as Miranda, a middle-aged novelist who agrees to have her teenage niece, Cyd (Jessie Pinnick), stay with her for the summer at her home in Chicago. Cone has a peerless eye for talent—he cast "Stranger Things" star Joe Keery in "Henry Gamble" before his career exploded—and the work he elicits from Spence and Pinnick is nothing short of sublime.







On paper, too easy a pairing: coming-of-age stories that are too intelligent to propose that this, here, is the end of a journey; characters (titular characters, no less) whose impulsiveness, close-mindedness, and selfishness are, of course, part of what makes them so empathetic; portraits in miniature of American towns and cities left unregarded in light of their bigger, glitzier counterparts.
