Her first play, *All Souls Day*, was produced with Lookingglass in 1992, followed by *dreaming lucia* in 1994. Some of her favorite roles onstage with Lookingglass include Sylv in *West*, Perfect Love in *The Arabian Nights*, Patty Drumgoole in *Up Against It* and Hester Prynne in *The Scarlet Letter*. She wrote the book and lyrics for the musical *The Shaggs: Philosophy of the World*, produced with Lookingglass in 2004 and later off-Broadway at Playwrights Horizons, where it was nominated for a 2011 Drama Critics' Circle Award and a Lucile Lortel Award. She co-adapted Studs Terkel's *Race: How Blacks and Whites Think & Feel About the American Obsession*, with Ensemble Member David Schwimmer, for Lookingglass' 2003 season. Her newest play *The Lonely Ape* is coming soon to a midsize, struggling American theater near you. Joy is also a writer/producer for series television, including *Madam Secretary* and *The Resident*. A feature film about White House press correspondent Connie Lawn is in development with director Anna Shapiro and Hyde Park Pictures.
